Oak Class Term 6 Newsletter



In our Sensory Playground we have


been looking after our plants and reading in the sunshine!







In literacy we have been learning to write for different purposes. We have written letters, designed an advert and written instructions. We have also concentrated on improving our punctuation.



In numeracy we have been learning about different angles and practicing how to order negative and positive numbers. We have enjoyed discovering different temperatures, using a thermometer and

recording our findings.



We have discovered lots of facts about Brazil this term. We have found out that the children go to school at 7am and finish at 10.45am, BUT they then do chores until 9pm!

We have designed and built our own carnival floats too.



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Literacy:

This term we are focussing on writing instructions. We have completed many tasks to order & follow instructions. We are developing our written work by writing instructions for others to follow. As part of our spelling, we are reinforcing the words we've learned by completing tasks dictated by our teacher. We are also reading play-scripts & making comparisons to novels.



Numeracy:

We are focussing on geometry & measures. We've learned to translate shapes and reflect. We have calculated area and perimeter. We will be identifying nets of shapes.

Outdoor Education:

This term we have been supported by an older pupil during Outdoor Education to act as a mentor to the younger pupils. We've explored new wild places such as; Heaven's gate & Savernake Forest. We are also starting to learn how to go Geocaching and learn and develop new bush-craft and survival skill. We have also enjoyed visits to Bowood County Park and local trampoline parks.



Summer Term 2019

During care we have been spending time making sure our chickens are well looked after and collecting their eggs.

We have also been fixing up old bikes and ensuring they will be ready to use in wales on the camping residential this year

Alongside these EGG-citing times we have also had some of the boys planting various vegetables and fruits

We even had time to go on an imaginary water ride, it was cracking!












PSHE Themes Term 6 2018-19








Food Technology







